1. Welcome to Process, Participants and Introductions

Stakeholders and guests introduced themselves. Nicki Rinehart provided a brief background of the CAM process.

2. Approval of previous meeting minutes

A motion was made and seconded (Susan Hart/Diane Oerly) for the September 2024 minutes to be approved. Motion passed.

3. MDNR/MS4/Stakeholder/Watershed Updates

David Carani and Lacy Herschvogel, both with HDR, gave a presentation on the City of Columbia's Integrated management Plan (IMP) for Wastewater and Stormwater.

Nicki Rinehart mentioned that Boone County is updating their Master Plan. The proposed plans can be found at www.ourboone.com. Comments will be collected until December 31, 2024.

Nicki Rinehart gave an update on the MS4 (Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System) permit renewal. The permit is jointly held between the City of Columbia, Boone County, and MU. The permit cycle is five years and expires in June 2025. The co-permittees will be posting the application and Stormwater Management Plan online for a 30-day public comment period by January 7, 2025.

Nicki Rinehart shared that the County is in the process of revising their stormwater ordinance. The ordinance revisions have been presented to the Planning and Zoning Commission and two public hearings have been held. Another public hearing will be held December 19, 2024, at 7:00 PM at the Boone County Government Center Commission Chambers. 4. Science Team Updates

USGS Chemical Analysis – David Avarez, USGS CERC, gave a presentation that provided an overview of chemical sampling project and an update on analyses. Dave says there is lots of data to evaluate and he's still waiting for a few analyses from contract labs. Once all data has been evaluated, David plans to post a public data release on ScienceBase and publish a final report and/or a journal manuscript.

Synoptic Sampling – Dr. Alba Argerich was scheduled to present on this topic. Due to time constraints, Dr. Argerich volunteered to table her presentation until the March meeting.

5. Action Team Updates

Nicki Rinehart provided an update on the Additional Hinkson Creek Surface Water Monitoring, Sampling, and Chloride Regression Model Development proposal. The intergovernmental three-party agreement has gone through Columbia City Council, and we are waiting to get a signed agreement from MU. Once that's received, the agreement can go through Boone County Commission. Once the agreement is through commission, we can amend the contract for the existing project with Geosyntec.

Website Redesign – Boone County's Webmaster is working on the redesign.

Logo Contest – Boone County's Webmaster designed a logo.

All-Team Meeting – In lieu of the All-Team meeting, the County partnered with Wisconsin Salt Wise to provide Salt Wise week the last week in January. The last day of the week is focused on monitoring, so the County is planning to have a presentation from Geosyntec on the current chloride study and do some chloride testing and monitoring at Flat Branch Creek. More information to come.

6. Riparian Subcommittee Updates

Updates were moved to the March agenda.

7. New Business

Tim Rielly is retiring from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources. This will be his last Stakeholder meeting. Mike Kruze will be taking his spot on the committee.

8. Old Business

CAM Stakeholder representative replacements – updates moved to the March agenda.

9. Collaborative Adaptive Management Committee Discussion of Next Steps

Nicki will send links to the Boone County Master Plan, Stormwater Ordinance revisions, and MS4 permit renewal comments. Michele will send the logo to everyone.
